Assistant/Associate Professor Rank Faculty Positions – Disability: Veterans Issues

The internationally renowned College of Applied Health Sciences (<http://ahs.illinois.edu>) at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign (<http://illinois.edu>) is dedicated to research, education, and outreach activities to promote healthy aging, healthy communities and improve the quality of life of people of all ages, physical abilities, and cultures to the greatest extent possible. The College is home to three academic units of Kinesiology and Community Health; Recreation, Sport and Tourism; and Speech and Hearing Science as well as the Division of Disability Resources and Educational Services. Our interdisciplinary faculty maintain active collaborations with engineering, education, psychology and nutritional sciences as well as the Center for Health Aging and Disability, Beckman Institute for Advanced Science and Technology, Center for Nutrition, Learning and Memory, College of Medicine, local hospitals and community organizations. They are housed within state of the art research facilities, including the recently completed \$10 million Khan Annex and forthcoming \$14 million Center for Wounded Veterans in Higher Education (<http://woundedvetcenter.ahs.illinois.edu>). The Wounded Veterans Center will be a national resource providing individualized, comprehensive support services to student veterans especially for those with poly-trauma.

Positions: The College of Applied Health Sciences is searching for two outstanding candidates with a strong research record in disabilities frequently observed in veterans including but not limited to post traumatic stress disorder, traumatic brain injury, sensory loss and mobility impairment. Other areas of interest include promotion of health and wellness among veterans with disabilities. Joint appointments in more than one academic unit of the college are possible.

Qualifications: Applicants must hold a doctoral degree at the time of appointment and have a record of research accomplishments that would qualify for appointment at the rank of Assistant or Associate Professor in any of the departments of the College

Salary: Commensurate with qualifications and experience.
