

Tenure Track Faculty Opening in Speech-Language Pathology at Assistant or Associate Rank

The School of Communication Sciences and Disorders is seeking applicants for a tenure-track position in speech-language pathology at the Assistant/Associate Professor rank with a preferred start date prior to Fall Semester, 2015. Applicants' teaching and research interests should be among the following areas: medical speech pathology, including dysphagia, voice and resonance disorders, and clinical anatomy and physiology; or developmental language disorders, speech sound disorders, autism, and normal language development. Additional areas of interest may include childhood onset fluency disorders, augmentative-alternative communication, or neurodevelopmental disorders.

Applicants must have earned a Ph.D. and CCC-SLP is desired. A successful candidate will be expected to conduct programmatic research and have an established record of publications and evidence of success, or potential, in obtaining extramural funding.

The School of CSD is an historically top ranked program offering graduate degrees in Speech-Language Pathology, Audiology, and research-oriented PhDs. A new building with ample lab space and state-of-the-art teaching facilities is under construction for occupancy in fall of 2015. Our dynamic program affords opportunities for innovative teaching and clinical training models, and mentoring. Collaborative opportunities exist within the school and with other units in the University, including the Institute for Intelligent Systems (an interdisciplinary cognitive science research cooperative), Psychology, Nursing, Computer Science, Electrical Engineering, Biomedical Engineering, and the School of Music; and in the region, including the University of Tennessee's Health Science Center and Le Bonheur Children's Hospital Neuroimaging facility.
