For Associate/Full Professor: Evidence of 1) an active, productive, and externally funded research program; 2) effective teaching; 3) commitment to service at the university or professional level.

Clinical certification;
Demonstrated interest in working across disciplinary boundaries;
Evidence of leadership in university or professional contexts commensurate with rank.
