**KELLY KING, AuD, PhD** is an Audiologist and Program Officer at The National Institute on Deafness and Other Communication Disorders (NIDCD). King oversees grants aimed at understanding hearing and hearing loss, as well as various treatments for communication disorders including hearing aids and cochlear implants. She leads several initiatives at the institute focused on workforce diversity and health disparities research, in addition to efforts aimed at making hearing healthcare more accessible and affordable.



**JOAN WINCENTZEN** has served as the Executive Director of the American Hearing Research Foundation (AHRF) since 2016. Wincentzen has nearly two decade's worth of experience in nonprofit management and administration. Early in her career, Wincentzen worked for 20 years in communication project management and as a freelance writer. A lifelong Illinoisan, Joan earned her MA from Northwestern University in English and her BA in Mathematics and English Literature from the University of St. Francis.



**SHARON E. MOSS, PhD, CCC-SLP, CAE** became the executive director of the American Speech-Language-Hearing Foundation (ASHFoundation) in October 2022. Moss is responsible for the ASHFoundation's leadership and management, fundraising, and mission-related program activities which include scholarship, research grant and special project initiatives. Additionally, Moss has been a member of the National Institute on Deafness and Other Communication Disorders Advisory Council and has

served on the boards of the National Black Association for Speech-Language and Hearing, as well as the American Heart Association (AHA) Mid-Atlantic Affiliate and AHA- Nation's Affiliate. Board certified in Neurogenic Communication Disorders, she is an American Speech-Language-Hearing Association Fellow and a Certified Association Executive.
